Heart4Harlow involvement has included the Dementia Drop-in at Latton, Kintsugi Hope (following a Forum-presentation) the developing ministry locally of Red Balloon Foundation (toddlers, children's and youth work), the Hope4Harlow drop-in in the early months of 2022, and the appointment of new FE College Chaplain Shaun Moore.

In the summer we were approached by Red Balloon Fundation ("RBF") who were thinking towards applying for funding to appoint a children's and youth worker in this area. We were asked if we thought there would be support for this. Following consultation we gave a


wait for the world to get back on its feet. This we hope will have an evangelistic tone.
